FROM PASTOR PHIL CAYZER'S DESK

AN OPPORTUNITY FOR CHURCH LEADERS TO TRAIN AND QUALIFY BEING ALLOWED TO LEAD CHURCHES

Believers in general and church leaders in particular around the world are invited to take advantage of a rare opportunity of affordable and convenient courses in Christian Ministry and Theology, offered by the CRC International Missions Bible College (IMBC) of Australia.

The college is a training arm of Christian Revival Crusade (CRC) Churches International. It equips men and women with relevant knowledge for ministry and missions of the gospel around the world. It offers a

year's Certificate course and a year's Diploma course respectively. Therefore, one is eligible for the Diploma course after completing the college's Certificate 4 level. The courses cover a wide range of foundational topics of the Bible and church management, also exposes the minister of the Gospel of what he should know and practice to succeed in his calling. The fact that the demand for theological and ministry training is growing daily, the college's online application system facilitates hundreds of students across many nations to register for the courses easily while at the same time meeting the official Australian Standard. The fact that in Africa and elsewhere in the world, Governments have of recent made it obligatory for Pastors, Evangelists and Preachers in general to possess basic training in theological training or Bible Studies from a recognized institution, before being allowed to lead churches or plant new ones, compels us present and would be church leaders, to ensure we have relevant training and documents to prove it.

Lack of the same is one of the reasons over 6,000 church buildings in Rwanda, mainly of the Pentecostal denomination, were closed three years ago causing a crisis of thousands of their members to miss their usual places of worship. As a result, novices are likely to have backslid since using social media like Zoom for church services is not possible due to erratic Internet and for the reason that not all church members possess smartphones or laptops.

THE IMBC TEAM


Here below is the IMBC team.

THE CRC CHURCH AT NYAKANDA REFUGEE CAMP Burundi

I am delighted to update you on the construction of the church at Nyankanda Refugee Camp in Burundi. It is very encouraging to see how far construction of the church building has reached. It is a good and big surprise that our dream of believing that the money we sent was enough to complete roofing the building as planned. The church is relatively big, 30 metres long and 15 metres wide. It is the first big Pentecostal church building in the area and the camp itself.

Although the dream is not yet attained, the stage we have reached is very encouraging. Because of the big size of the building, the church's elders used a lot of timber that cost them a lot of money. I truly take this opportunity to thank our brothers and sisters in the Nyakanda church, especially Pr Magorwa and Brother Guy for their stringent supervision of the construction. It was through their such stance and efforts that made the achievement possible. Although construction of the building is not fully completed, the pace of the construction gives us hope to complete the construction soon.

The elders of the CRC Nyakanda refugee church asked me to deliver their report to you. They also urged me to express their gratitude to Pr Phil and Norma Cayzer particularly, to Pr Mike and Lois Cronin and generally to all CRC Australia leaders and all members of the CRC movement. They thank everyone for their financial and moral support and their strong partnership with the church at Nyakanda.

All the same, the Pastor of the CRC church and his church elders, continue to request you as their spiritual guiders (coaches) and supporters to continue supporting them until the church is completed. They said that through the construction of the church, CRC Churches International speaks loudly by actions and communicates pragmatically in Burundi.

The news that encouraged me and surprised many people, is what I heard from the Coordinator of the department of women. She said that due to the pain of not having a place to gather for worship, and especially the difficulties they encounter during the rainy season when they gather under trees, women themselves are strongly supporting the construction work with their own hands. Others sold their clothes and contributed the money to help in the construction of the church. She said that she encourages a big group of women to support the church builders with food to provide them with energy they need to continue constructing the church as they should.

I personally thank all of our Australian brethren for their considerable contributions in helping our brethren at Nyankanda Refugee Camp. I am also moved in the way those brothers at the camp, defy their destitute like status of being refugees and make their contribution to the construction of the church building in kind. They do so, knowing that although they have no money to contribute, they have life and strength which they owe to God. This is because they even get their food for survival from the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR

Unexpected events in the year 2020 caused us to learn how to use Zoom and it seems we shall continue doing so in the year 2021 even spend many more hours looking deep into the camera and at people's faces on screens of our gadgets.

Thank you for the amazing generosity of various CRC churches for their giving towards the technology needed to conduct online communication. Funds collected during the National Missions Day in July 2020 have been an amazing provision.

The funds have allowed us to improve the quality of the Zoom sessions at both ends, by purchasing laptops, video cameras and upgrading Wi-Fi connections.

However, there are still some issues that remain out of our control. For example, the 24-hour blackouts. This means, mobile phones and laptops cannot always be charged, and Wi-Fi Internet connections do not always work. But still we have been able to make significant improvements in the quality of our Zoom sessions.

Although I have not been able to physically travel to various nations and share God's Word, it has been a joy to be able to continue sharing the Word using technology in many different nations. This includes the following nations and ministry:

India

Weekly devotional sessions with the whole team in India: Imphal team, Assam church team and the Siliguri team. These sessions include training, encouragement and prayer. Spent times are a great joy indeed.

Training schools in India were closed for most of 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic so we tried Zoom

sessions once a week with the students connecting themselves via their mobile phones. We gave it a good attempt, but between issues of poor Internet connection, flat batteries and no data, the same was not sustainable.

Ghana

The training school was able to reopen towards the latter part of 2020 so I was able to conduct weekly lectures to Ghana.


Papua New Guinea

Throughout 2020 I was able to be part of the Bethel services in Port Moresby, chapel with the Bethel staff and students on a number of occasions, as well as regular time with the Frontier Evangelism team.

Other

In addition to the above, one other thing that I have been able to do is post online devotions, for about four months, through the Pathway to Missions Facebook group.

Although the COVID-19 pandemic has shut down many things, the Word of God has continued to be carried out and planted throughout the nations.



Report from Ps Vishnu in Mauritius.

Our CRC IMBC courses are going on well. We started a Certificate Course last year 2020 with 9 students. We are two Trainers, myself, Ps Vishnu Durgadoo and my Assistant Ps Atish Lugun.

At the moment, we are doing our eighth book titled, Bible Prophecy and will end the course with our ninth Book, titled Hermeneutics. God willing and He is willing, we shall conduct our first Certificates' award in September 2021.

Because of COVID -19 restriction, we are however obliged to do the classes on Zoom. This is because we are not allowed to meet in church or elsewhere.

Two other Pastors who were supposed to start IMBC courses for their students could not do so because of COVID - 19 restrictions and that not all students could have access to Zoom facilities. When I contacted them, they told me they will start the courses when the COVID -19 restrictions are lifted.

EDITORIAL

We thank God for the good events that include new churches which were constructed and opened in Burundi at Nyankanda and Gosogwe Refugee Camps respectively. We also thank Him for the new Bible Schools and the graduations that accompanied them. Likewise, we thank Him for a cost-effective printing press in Kenya by Bishop John Masika at Njoro which is another blessing to us and CRC work in Eastern and Central Africa. God who has enabled us attain that; He will also enable us to achieve what we have not achieved. For He is still on His throne to see us through. All we need to do is to stand right with Him all the time, including being a source of peace with everyone around us, as far as it depends on us to do so and should be holy (Romans 12:17-21, Hebrews 12:14). We must also be sincere always in our hearts and in deeds without hypocrisy and lies. For without which, the Bible says, we shall not see God when we need Him and even on the last day (Matthew 5:8). God forbid. As His co-workers in everything we do (1 Corinthians 3:9), we must also submit and surrender to Him everything we intend to do before doing it for our plans to succeed (Proverbs 16:3). He was very much expected to contribute to facilitation of an enabling environment for the Great Commission in Tanzania and influencing the rest of Africa with the same, particularly Africa south of the Sahara. As renown Pr Dr Martin Sempa of Kampala, Uganda said immediately after President Magufuli's death, Africa lost a man of God. We miss him. We thank God for his patriotic and exemplary leadership.

Another bad thing is the recent incident of a disastrous volcanic eruption of Mount Nyiragongo in Goma, the Democratic Republic of Congo that occurred on 22 May 2021. It killed hundreds of people and devastated the area's biodiversity and property because of also the earthquake that accompanied it plus the repeated aftershocks. Following which, thousands of residents of Goma and the environs fled to neighbouring areas and countries, including our CRC church Pastor Jamari whose church property and that of his house was spoiled and vandalised. Therefore, he very much needs our prayers and material assistance wherever he is for his family, church members and neighbours. Although the area's infrastructure was disrupted including telephone communication, we should make an effort to call him individually to guide us on how we to send him assistance and send it to him.
